In our sport, determining a clear pass/fail for movement is open to interpretation.

During an informal poll using the entire IDPA Staff at Nationals, no two answers were exactly the same. There is a way to circumvent every definition which becomes a distraction.

While it may be used as an instruction in a Written Stage Description, it is no longer something a Safety Officer may judge using a subjective opinion.

This brings the question of what to do when a shooter chooses to spend his or her time standing on a stage that has movement written in to the stage briefing. The answer is simple, score the time. At the appropriate time, a competitor will discover what is best for them.

IDPA matches should be scored and decided based on the amount of time a shooter took to complete a stage along with any points down scored due to marksmanship. The shooting action.
